GLOBAL STUDIES I 2016-2017 Mrs. Palmer Introduction and Course Information

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Global Studies I is a challenging course required for graduation. <u>It is the first year of a two-part course culminating in a Regents examination at the end of 10th grade.</u> In this Global I course, students will learn about the history and culture of our world beginning from ancient times through the age of exploration and colonization (approximately 1600 AD). Students will develop knowledge of world history, government, economics, geography, art, literature, and world religions. We will also discuss current events as they relate to the history we study.

Throughout the course students will complete several types of assignments, projects, tests, and essays to help reach an understanding of this important historical information. Multiple learning styles are addressed via multiple teaching avenues. Students will use their textbook for reading and homework assignments. We will also gain information via class lectures, podcasts, discussions, online blogging and project work. This is a "hands on" experience for students so as to maximize retention and success!

GRADES*

The final course grade will be based on 4 quarterly averages. The grades for each quarter will be graded according to the following weights:

Unit Tests, projects and DBQ's	50%
Weekly quizzes and notebook quizzes	15%
Homework/Classwork Grade	25%
Classroom Participation/Preparation	10%

* There may be other announced assignments added at various weights throughout the year.

HOMEWORK

Homework assignments are posted every Monday for the week. Homework assignments will include student review of chapter notes and recording the same in their composition notebook. These notebooks will be graded, checked and often used for open notebook quizzes. The notes will be accessed online. Students who do not have internet access at home will be allowed to access the information in school either in the Media Center or in my classroom 9th periods.

Homework is due at the beginning of class on its due date. LATE HOMEWORK WILL NOT RECEIVE CREDIT WITHOUT A WRITTEN EXCUSE FROM A PARENT. STUDENTS WITHOUT HOMEWORK MAY BE REQUIRED TO COMPLETE THE WORK 9TH PERIOD OF THAT SAME DAY. Students needing extra help will be required to stay during 9th period review sessions. The days for these sessions will be posted on the website calendar.

QUIZZES

Pop quizzes may be given periodically to test student's knowledge after completion of these assignments. *Students should expect a quiz every Friday.*
