Christmas can be many things and for many, it is most definitely nostalgic! Think about the popularity of Norman Rockwell illustrations, "A Christmas Story" movie (and the Red Ryder BB Gun, and how often "The Wizard of Oz" airs on television this time of year! The sentimental longings of yesteryear, as well as missing loved ones who are away from us, really tug at our heart strings. Often we think of our elders at this time of year as well especially imagining all the Christmases they've seen! My own dad talks about the good times at the old farm homestead, then as a teen with his siblings and also when times were lean. He always mentions his mother getting oranges at the residential boarding school and how she continued to give her kids oranges and then giving me oranges in my stocking as a child.

It is our responsibility to care for our elders. One time someone suggested that we get assisted living facilities on our nations. Well, taking care of our elders is an awesome responsibility we have as Indigenous people. Families take care of each other. I knew a family whose matriarch was 105 and she lived with her 80 year-old widowed daughter and her 60 year-old grandson. Elders are our connection to the past and we have to care for them!

This year, the Native American Office will be helping to care for our Elders. We are collecting non-perishables as a goodwill gesture. We are also creating tasty ornaments for approximately 50 elders. Our students will find Christmas joy in giving to our Elders! Enjoy your elders while you can and have a blessed holiday season!
