

STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES



Successful planning requires you to S.O.A.R Schedule, Organize, Act, Review! The Agenda is a perfect place to accurately write down your assignments, list due dates, prioritize your school work and manage your time effectively.

Some TIPS for using your Agenda are:

- Use details when writing down the assignment (ie:page numbers, just odd number problems, etc.)
- Write down the supplies needed (ie:bring Lightning Thief Wednesday)
- Don't leave a blank space if there is no homework. Write down "none" or "0". This will help avoid second guessing if an assignment was just forgotten or if there was truly no homework given.
- When you have completed an assignment, cross it out or put a check mark next to it in your Agenda. This will help you to know what has been completed and give you a sense of accomplishment that things are getting done!
- Plan out long range assignments in your Agenda. Write down the assignment on the due date and every day before the due date.
- Chunk large assignments into smaller pieces and write that plan in the Agenda (ie: study 5 vocab words Tues, 5 vocab words Wed and then all vocab words Thurs.)
- Use different color pens or highlighters to "color code" your Agenda (ie: test/quizzes in red, homework in black, long range assignments in green.)

Families are super busy these days, but setting time aside each night to review your child's Agenda and verify that homework has been completed can help assist them in growing their organizational skills and accountability to their academics.

Other helpful TIPS!

- Complete homework as close to after school/sports as possible, before getting into relaxation mode.
- Make sure to refer to the Agenda as a To-Do List as homework is being completed.
- Do the hardest/least liked assignments first when energy levels are higher and more time is available.
- If time allows, reward verified homework completion with participation in a desired activity.

Winter 2023-2024 Sports Registration is OPEN!

Parents of Akron High School or Middle School student athletes participating in a winter sport at any level, including modified, will need to register their child on the school's registration platform, FamilyID, at www.akronschools.org/FamilyID. Registration is currently open for those wishing to participate in Varsity, JV and Modified boys or girls basketball; Varsity and Modified swimming for boys and girls; Varsity wrestling, Varsity competitive basketball cheerleading and Unified Bowling.

Parents can also get to the school's FamilyID platform by going to <u>akronschools.org/athletics</u> and clicking on SPORTS REGISTRATION from the left navigation menu. The program will guide users through the registration process.

All athletes must be registered prior to the start of winter sport practices that begin Wednesday, November 1, 2023 for Modified Girls Basketball, Monday, November 13, 2023, for all JV and varsity teams, and January 2, 2024 for Modified Swimming and Boys Basketball.

Sports physicals must also be turned in to the school nurse prior to participation in any practices or submitted on the FamilyID webpage.

2023 CARDBOARD BOAT RACE

On Wednesday, October 11th, as part of the annual Homecoming Week festivities, 33 teams Akron Middle School students participated in the 2023 Cardboard Boat race at the school pool during a special assembly. This event has become a loved annual tradition for students in grades 6-8. Students are encouraged to participate by forming a team of 2-4 peers and building a boat out of nothing but normal everyday corrugated cardboard and duct tape. The duct tape can only be used on seams to hold the cardboard together. The tape can not be used as a waterproofing membrane on the bottom or sides of the boat, or between layers of cardboard. This presents an engineering challenge for students as they have to decide what shape and construction design will prove most "sea-worthy". Two members of each team must then race for time against the other teams as they paddle their boats the length of the school pool and back in heats of three.

At the conclusion of the event, awards were distributed to the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place teams based on time. The first place team was given season passes to Darien Lake Six Flags for the 2024 season. The winners with a time of 0:56 were Da Cute Cucumbers (Ayla Jagielo and Aleece O'Malley). The remaining prizes for all other categories were day passes to Darien Lake Six Flags to be used during the 2024 season. Second place went to Ocean Gate (Sam Pingatore, Camden Jendreski, Mason Smith) with a time of 0:59, and third place was Pickle (Lilly Sears, Briana Wind, Delaina Blair) with a time of 1:01.

Special awards were also given out for the following: Best Construction Design - most creative design and best use of cardboard (Da Cute Cucumber: Ayla Jagielo, Aleece O'Malley), Best Dressed Team - the costumes may be funny, spiffy, or elegant . . but they must be creative (Happy Holidayz: Montana Burg, Karlie Reeb, Brooklyn Gerstung, Anieka Forrestel), Team Spirit - the most spirited and energetic team . . the looks of the boat don't count here (Under the Sea:Brook Wood, Elsa Cottle, Kendal Murray, Sarah Piscitelli) , and the Titanic Award - the most spectacular but unplanned sinking (S.S. Monkey; Vincent Mastrorilli, Jakob Sommers, Quin O'Malley, Declan Jelson).

Highlights of the day included Mr. Caprio (MS Principal) and Mrs. Kersten (Interim Superintendent) sinking in their cardboard boat during the teacher race and Channel 7 News coming to capture the event for the evening news. The Channel 7 reporter even got in a boat and tried it out for himself.

AKRON SCHOOLS HOSTS CAR SEAT SAFETY CHECK ON NOVEMBER 11th

AKRON, NEW YORK (October 30, 2023) – Akron Central Schools is hosting a free car seat safety check by the Akron Police Department and Erie County Sheriff's Office on Saturday, November 11, 2023, from 10:00AM to 2:00PM. The event will be held at the school's bus transportation facility. Participants can access the facility from John Street.

Trained officers will check to be sure car seats are installed properly in vehicles. They will also check for expired car seats and whether a car seat has a safety recall. Children can be in the car seat during the safety check to help determine the proper fit. The safety check takes about fifteen minutes to complete.

Officers will also be able to answer any questions about laws pertaining to car seat usage. For additional questions, please contact the District Office at (716)542-5006.

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
