# STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

As the grass starts to get greener and the flowers bloom, the anxiety about upcoming exams and the end of the school year can be pretty overwhelming for many of us.Let's take a minute to really delve into the world of test anxiety!

What is test anxiety anyway? Test anxiety is being so upset, worried or afraid about a test or quiz that your performance suffers. Test anxiety can have both physical and emotional effects (ie: upset stomach, headaches, memory lapse, mental blocks, anger, etc.). The causes for test anxiety can vary widely (bad experiences, poor study habits, comparing yourself to others, lack of stress management skills, etc.). The important thing to focus on, is that no matter what the cause, you can learn to reduce test anxiety!

Here are some helpful tips!

- Participate in class. Raise your hand. Ask questions.
- •Talk to your teacher. Stay 9th period. Ask questions. Ask for help.
- •Avoid "cramming". Study over at least a week's time. Use your Agenda to map out your study time. Consider studying with groups of other students.
- •Manage your stress. Think positively (I can do this). Eat well. Get enough sleep. Use relaxation techniques (deep breathing, etc.).
- •Get help if you need it (talk to your School Counselor, School Social Worker, Native American Liaison or School Psychologist)
